1 RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

Where applicable the rules from the Nordic Sailing Federation (printed in the Scandinavian versions of RRS) will be valid.

From sunset to sunrise the rules of Part 2 are replaced by the right-of-way rules of the Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (IRPCAS).

- **1.2** ISAF "2017-2019 Offshore Special Regulations", Category 3 will apply, with the following additions:
 - Bilge pumps; minimum 1 manually operated.
 - Fixed mounted VHF with 25 W effect
 - VHF antenna must be mounted so that land based stations can be reached at any time
 - A heavy weather jib and mainsail where the luff can be reduced by at least 40%"
 - If the mainsail can't be reefed accordingly, a try sail must be on board
 - A furling jib can be accepted in lieu of a heavy weather jib
 - For those starting from Arendal the following must be on board:
 - o EPIRB
 - or
 - o Certified Raft
- **1.3** Racing rule 52 (Manual Power) does not apply.
- **1.4** If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.



2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors before start will be posted on the official notice board located at the clubhouse in Åsgårdstrand and Arendal at least one hour prior to first start **and at the official regatta webpage**. Boats starting from Helsingør, Aarhus and Marstrand will find all information on the regatta webpage.

Notices to competitors after finishing will be posted on the official notice board at the Race Office located in Skagen.

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any changes to the sailing instructions will be posted before 17:00 on the day it will take effect. Flag "L" will then be displayed at the race Offices and on the starting boats (where applicable) in Åsgårdstrand, Arendal, Aarhus, Helsingør and Marstrand and the changes will be published on the official regatta webpage.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed as follows:

Åsgårdstrand: at signal-mast close to seaward approach to Northern Harbor in Åsgårdstrand.

Arendal: at signal-mast close to the race office

Helsingør: at signal mast close to the race office

Aarhus: at signal mast close to the race office

Marstrand: at signal-mast in starting area

4.2 When flag "AP" is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 minutes' in race signal "AP".

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.1 Dates of racing:

• Start: May 29th

5.2 The scheduled time of the warning signal for

- Shorthand classes: 18:50
- Other classes: 19:50
- Warning signal for starts from Aarhus and Helsingør will be as follows:

Short hand classes and other classes: 18:30



Division of classes and scheduled starting times will be posted on <u>skagen-race.no</u> before the first registration day.

5.3 Classes

5.3.1 Touring

Boats without valid measurement certificate sail in Touring class. Race Committee changes from NOR Rating to Touring due to invalid measurement certificates are final and not ground for redress. This changes Rules 60.1 (b).

All boats in Touring class must sail without spinnaker, and just one headsail (max 150% J) connected to the forestay at any time.

5.3.2 NOR Rating or DH/SRS with or without spinnaker

Boats sailing according to the NOR Rating-system or DH/SRS will be placed in classes based on measurement rating, at the Race Committee's discretion.

5.3.3 Shorthanded NOR Rating or DH / SRS.

Boats with a crew of 2 or less sailors must sail as "Shorthanded NOR Rating" or SRS Shorthanded. Boats sailing according to the NOR Rating-system or SRS Shorthanded will be placed in classes based on measurement rating at the Race Committee's discretion.

5.3.4 <u>Tour pleasure</u>

Boats sailing in this class will start when it pleases them at the predefined starting area within the defined time period and will sail with a tracer that records start and sailed time. Starting areas and rules governing this particular class will be published separately on the regatta homepage

6 CLASS FLAGS

Class flags will be posted together with division of classes on <u>www.SEILmagasinet.no</u> Monday 27 of may 18:00.

All boats shall display class flag in the backstay.

7 RACING AREAS

8 THE START

Prior to the start the participating boats must complete the following:

For all boats starting:

Shall register with the race office,

Complete and submit the crew list and the safety checklist which is found on the regattas homepage <u>skagen-race.no</u> or submit a hard copy to the race office prior to start. Failing to do so will result in a penalty.

For all boats the following applies:

If you have entered as a participant in the race and are unable to start you **must** report this to the race office by cell phone to **(+47) 91324226**, boats failing to follow this can be held responsible for cost following SAR operations.

Boats are required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority. All boats may carry an event sponsor flag below their starboard spreader and a eventsticker on the mainsail boom, starboard side, farthest back. For the duration of the regatta (29.05 – 31.05) no other sponsor flag/material than those from the official Skagen Race sponsors will be allowed to be displayed on the boat or dockside unless an application to do so has been approved by the Skagen Race organisers.

Random safety checks will be carried out at all points of starts and boats must have a copy of their safety checklist available.

8.1 Races will be started as follows:



The warning signal for each succeeding class shall be made with or after the starting signal of the preceding class

This changes rule 26.

8.2 The starting line will be as follows:

Arendal: At the yacht harbour, a closer description will be posted on <u>skagen-race.no</u>.

Åsgårdstrand: Between the Race Committee signal boat, outside Åsgårdstrand Harbor, displaying orange flag at the starboard end and a red buoy at the port end.

Helsingør: Just outside the yacht harbour (Nordhavn) between two orange buoys. The starter boat will be alongside one of the buoys.

Aarhus: Between the Race Committee signal boat, outside Aarhus Yacht harbor (just outside Aarhus International Sailing Center) displaying an orange flag at the starboard end and a buoy with an orange flag at the port end.

Marstrand: Between mast ashore at Marstrand and a red buoy at the port end.

- **8.3** No boats shall enter the starting area before warning signal. Boats waiting for warning signal shall remain in the designated waiting area. See Attachment B.
- **8.4** A boat starting later than 15 minutes after the last starting signal will be scored DNS (Did Not Start).

• Checkpoint 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 shall be left on your starboard side

- Boats starting from Aarhus and Helsingør must keep Hirseholmene to port
- Finish line outside the breakwater before the entry gate to Skagen harbour

No boats are permitted west of E 10°25.0' after passing Sørgrundsberget mark.

The approximate course length from Åsgårdstrand and Marstrand will be 110 nm.

The approximate course length from Arendal will be 120 nm.

The approximate course length from Aarhus will be 118 nm

The approximate course length from Helsingør will be 122 nm



9.2 Legs of the course will not be changed after the preparatory signal. This changes rule 33.

10 REPORTING POINTS

No mark boats will be used. A missing or damaged mark will not be ground for redress. This changes rule 60.1 (b)

Racing boats shall complete Self Declaration Race Report. When passing each listed mark, date, time, boats ahead and astern shall be registered (if possible).

Racing boats shall also transmit blind on VHF channel 72 sail-number, boat name and passing time when passing

- Start from Åsgårdstand Skålholmen light house, Sørgrundsberget mark,
- Start from Arendal Jomfruland reef Skålholmen light house Sørgrundsberget mark (SB)
- Start from Marstrand, Sweden Skålgrund (southmark)

11 THE FINISH

Before and after passing the finish line racing boats shall listen to VHF channel 72, for possible messages from the Race Committee. The Race Committee will only confirm, when possible, that they have received the VHF message that a boat has reported their crossing of the finish line and their sail number and nothing more pertaining to the race.

- **11.1** The finishing line will be between flagpole ashore displaying Engelsviken canning flag outside "Engelsviken factory" and red buoy at port side. Race Committee will try to add a white flashing light to the buoy.
- **11.2** Boats passing finish line at night shall show sail-number using flash light and if necessary adjust sail accordingly.
- **11.3** Official finish time is registered by the Race Committee ashore.
- **11.4** If the Race Committee is absent when a boat finishes, she must report her finishing time, her position in relation to nearby boats, to the Race Committee at the first reasonable opportunity.



11.5 Participating boats shall berth according to instructions from the Race Committee members, also present in the harbour on the water in yellow or grey RIB's or Skagen Harbour crew.

11.6 Completed and signed Self Declaration Race Report and Self Declaration Safety Form must be delivered at the Race Committee Office in Skagen no later than 120 minutes after crossing the finishing line.

12 PENALTY SYSTEM

The penalties are as follows:

- **12.2** For all classes rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only a one turn penalty, including one tack and one gybe, is required.
- 12.3 Boats refusing to show up at safety inspection, or where the equipment is not in accordance with safety rules may be refused to start, or penalized with a 1 3 % penalty or DSQ.
- **12.4** The Protest Committee reserves the right to give a penalty without hearing for any breach reported in Self Declaration Race Report. This changes the Rules in Part 5.

13 TIME LIMITS

Time limits are as follows:

14 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

14.1 Protest forms are available at the Race Office. Protests shall be delivered there within the protest time limit.

14.2 For each boat, the protest time limit is 120 minutes after the boat has crossed the finishing line.

- **14.3** Notices will be posted at the Race Office in Skagen to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. The Race Committee will try to call the skipper by mobile phone to inform when to meet for a hearing. Hearings will be held in the jury room, located at "Pakhuset", meeting room on the 1st floor.
- **14.4** A request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered
 - (a) within the protest time limit if the part requesting reopening was informed of the decision;
 - (b) no later than 30 minutes after the part requesting reopening was informed of the decision.

This changes rule 66.

15 SCORING

The scoring systems are as follows:

- Cruising classes; Elapsed sailing time (no time correction)
- All NOR Rating or DH/SRS rating classes; Corrected sailing time will be elapsed sailing time multiplied with the boats NOR Rating or DH/SRS Rating correction factor.

16 SAFETY REGULATIONS

A boat that retires from a race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible.

Boats outside mobile connection range must report retiring from the race using VHF costal radio reaching one of the phone numbers above. When reporting retiring, crewmembers must ensure that the Race Committee in Skagen has received the boat's name and sail number.

Boats not finishing or reporting retiring can be financial liable for SAR cost.

Skagen race harbour master can be reached on VHF channel 72 (use low output setting)

17 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

Substitution of competitors will not be allowed without submission of updated Crew list on the online registrations system at <u>skagen-race.no</u>.

18 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions.

19 OFFICIAL BOATS

Official boats will be marked with Bærum Seilforening logos/standers.

20 SUPPORT BOATS

Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first class to start until all boats have finished or the Race Committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.

21 PRESS

Event sponsors and press crew can embark and disembark racing boats at any time. Any boats use of engine in this process will not be subject to penalties.

22 PRIZES



Prize ceremony will take place in Skagen Harbor, at the windjammer "Christian Radich" weather permitting or in the "Auktionshallen" on Friday May 31th, approx. at 12:00

23 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

24 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.

25 Media and information


All participants accept the receipt of newsletters from the organizer before, during and after the race. This applies to the both skipper and crew.

Should the organizer decide to use tracking devices during the race the participants has to adhere to the instruction as to how to use them and where to place them.





Signal mast A Race committee signal boat


Club house

Starting area Aarhus:






Starting Area Helsingør:






Starting area Marstrand:
